## **MUSIC MINISTRY**

## "...and sing the love amazing..."

Candlemas marks the traditional conclusion of the Christmas season, and we will sing, "Joy to the World, the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King." The lyrics to this hymn were written by the renowned English poet Isaac Watts in 1719 and were never intended for Christmas. Watts aimed to set the words of Psalm 98 and Genesis 3 into a poem. For nearly two hundred years, "Joy to the World" was sung as a general praise hymn. The words were not sung to the familiar tune we know today until the early 20th century. This melody began appearing in hymnals in the 1950s and is now regarded as one of the most well-known Christmas carols ever.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Agatha, a revered early Christian martyr and saint, was born in Sicily around 231 AD. She is celebrated for her faith and courage in the face of brutal persecution. According to tradition, she was a young woman of noble birth who dedicated her life to chastity and service to God. Her beauty and piety caught the attention of a Roman official who attempted to force her to renounce her faith and accept his advances. When she refused, she was subjected to horrific torture.

Despite her suffering, Agatha remained resolute in her devotion to Christ, reportedly finding comfort and healing through divine intervention. She ultimately died in prison, likely around 251 AD. St. Agatha's story continues to inspire millions, symbolizing the strength of faith and the resilience of the human spirit in the face of suffering.

# DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

Happy Candlemas! In the pre-Council calendar we called it the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary (it is also still called this by the Orthodox). In the post-Conciliar calendar we call it the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple. But both also refer to it as Candlemas, as candles have been blessed on this date, in conjunction with Christ, the Light of the World, entering into the Temple. May Christ light our way each day!!

Monday we have the popular devotion to St. Blase (or Blaise) with the blessing of throats. According to tradition, there was a boy choking on a fishbone, and St. Blase prayed over the boy and he stopped choking. I'll do the blessing during the 12:10 p.m. Mass (so be prepared for the Mass to be slightly longer than usual).

Saturday we celebrate the anniversary of the Dedication of St. Matthew Church. We're going to have an Ordinary Form Mass at 5 p.m. to celebrate this great day in

the life of our parish. It will count for your Sunday obligation.

Saturday we also have a meeting at 2 p.m. for anyone interested in the Bourbon and Basilicas pilgrimage. We need to 20 people to make the trip a go. We'll have representatives from Corporate Travel present to answer any questions, and I'll have more flyers/registration forms. Anyone is welcome to come to the meeting and on the trip, even if they're not parishioners or even Catholic (though we will have Mass every day and have time to talk about faith).

Last, and not least, St. John in Davison is hosting the annual Knights of Columbus Spaghetti Dinner to raise money for seminarians. There is a poster in the back of the church, and the Knights will be present this weekend if you want to purchase your tickets. There is a cap on how many people can attend, so get your tickets while you can!

## **CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD**

The parable of the woman leavening dough reminds the child that although great and magnificent, the Kingdom of God begins in smallness, often in a hidden way, like the yeast mixed into a dough. In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd atrium the children reflect upon the mysterious growth and transformation of the kingdom.

- Do you have a favorite parable from the Gospels?
- Choose a parable and re-read it each night as part of your personal prayer.
- Wonder what Jesus meant when he said the Kingdom of God is like ...
- Consider what is the reality of the Kingdom that the parable is revealing to you?

The group will pray Vespers and study the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which is available as a book and for free on the Vatican website.

#### BENEDICTINE ARRANGEMENT

Pope Benedict XVI, deeply influenced by the Benedictine tradition, emphasized the sacredness and theological depth of the altar arrangement, advocating a return to traditional liturgical elements. Central to his vision was



the placement of a prominent crucifix at the center of the altar, directing both priest and congregation toward Christ's sacrifice rather than each other. He also encouraged the use of six tall candles, reflecting historical liturgical practices, and often promoted the *ad orientem* posture, in which the priest and faithful face the same direction in worship, symbolizing a communal journey toward God. For Benedict XVI, the altar was the true focal point of Catholic worship, where heaven and earth meet in the Eucharistic sacrifice. His reforms sought to restore continuity with the Church's ancient traditions, deepening the understanding of the Mass as a sacred encounter with God and leaving a lasting impact on modern liturgical practices.
