This week I celebrate two important birthdays: one important to me biologically, and the other important to me spiritually. My dad's birthday is Monday, 21 October, and Bishop Mengeling's birthday is Tuesday, 22 October. My dad helped to give me life, and Bishop Mengeling admitted me to the seminary. I am blessed by both my biological and spiritual father and their presence in my life! Ad multos annos!!

One of the great blessings of living at the rectory is my ability to do more without having to take into account the travel time from St. Pius X to St. Matthew. So, beginning immediately, I'll be doing a rosary walk around the block of St. Matthew (Beach, 4th, Church, and 3rd) after confessions on Saturdays. Right now, I plan to do so in rain, shine, snow, or other weather, as long as its not a danger to walk outside (like thunderstorms, tornadoes, or frigid cold). If I'm gone on a Saturday, feel free to still do the rosary walk and invoke our Blessed Mother's intercession and protection of our parish campus and parishioners.

Secondly, beginning the first full week of November (which is right around the corner!), I'll be praying Lauds (Morning Prayer) in the church at 7:00 a.m. on Mondays and Fridays. It will be the post-Conciliar Divine Office. This is open to everyone, even non-Catholics (since there is no holy Communion), but especially is directed towards those who want to start their day with prayer, but can't make a Mass due to their work schedule. I'll have books or pamphlets for everyone to use.

CHRIST THE KING

The sovereignty of Christ in tradition emphasizes His supreme authority over all creation, rooted in Scripture, particularly in Matthew 28:18, where Jesus states, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." This concept is not limited to a political realm but encompasses a spiritual reign characterized by love, justice, and peace. The Feast of Christ the King serves as a reminder of this sovereignty, calling the faithful to recognize His lordship in their lives and societal struc-



tures. We are encouraged to uphold His teachings and embody His values in our communities, understanding that true freedom and fulfillment come from living under Christ's reign, which offers an alternative to worldly power.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Anthony Mary Claret was a Spanish archbishop and missionary, best known as the founder of the Claretians, or the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Born in Sallent, Spain, Claret became a priest in 1835 and was deeply committed to preaching and evangelizing, often traveling on foot to spread the Gospel. His fervent sermons drew large crowds,

and he became renowned for his missionary work across Catalonia. In 1850, Claret was appointed Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, where he worked to reform

both the clergy and laity, emphasizing education, social justice, and the rights of the poor. Despite facing opposition, including multiple assassination attempts, he persisted in his mission, which included establishing schools and agricultural programs. Claret also had a deep devotion to the Virgin Mary and promoted Marian spirituality throughout his life. He returned to Spain in 1857, where he continued his missionary work and advised Queen Isabella II. Canonized in

his missionary work and advised Queen Isabella II. Canonized in 1950, St. Anthony Mary Claret's legacy lives on through the Claretian order, which continues his mission of evangelization and social reform globally.

NORTH END SOUP KITCHEN


