Both hymns use the same tune, known by its German name, "Lasst uns erfreuen herzlich sehr." (Let us rejoice most heartily.) The tune dates back to 1623 and was known as a majestic processional hymn. For centuries, this tune was known as a walking hymn used for stately outdoor religious processions. In the early 20th century, the tune was paired with two favorite texts—the hymns we will sing today. It is also known as the "Alleluia" hymn due to its recurring use of the acclamation "alleluia." DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

We have a lot going on this week into next week! First, today is the anniversary of the establishment of St. Matthew Parish. Bishop John S. Foley, Bishop of Detroit (Detroit didn't become an Archdiocese until after the Diocese of Lansing was founded in 1937) created St. Matthew parish to continue to serve the people of Flint, after St. Michael parish was founded as the first parish in Flint. We have had many ups and downs as a parish over our 113 years, but we continue to spread the Gospel to the people of Flint. May God bless and sustain us for many more years!!

Today we also kick off the Stewardship for Saints and Scholars diocesan capital campaign. The Diocese of Lansing has asked us to raise \$405,000, a number which is based upon the average of the past three years' worth of collections. We have decided to expand that goal to \$580,000 to help fund some of our local needs. For the first \$405,000, we will receive 20% of every dollar paid on pledges to the campaign. Once we reach \$405,000, we will receive 100% of every dollar paid on pledges.

You will have the chance to pay your pledge over 5 years (so we are asking for \$116,000 per year). You should receive a letter in the mail from Bishop Boyea asking you to consider donating a specific amount over five years (the number you will receive will be the five-year total). If you can give that, great! If you can give more, even better!! If that number doesn't reflect responsible stewardship right now, don't worry! You can give what you think the Lord is asking you to sacrifice, and we will be happy for that gift, whatever it is. This campaign will help support Catholic education, including increased scholarships for families, increased pay for teachers, and increased resources for students with special needs. For our parish amount, we will be raising money for our buildings and grounds fund, which will pay for projects like refurbishing our bathrooms in the field house and in the basement of the church; renovating our hall to be more inviting of a space; and, if we have enough money, maybe even updating our kitchen so that you can actually cook in it! Whatever we are able to raise, I want to express my gratitude to you for your generosity!!

This week, the priests of the Diocese of Lansing will be on Convocation (think mini-retreat). I will say Mass on Monday, but then will leave for the Convocation. There will still be Adoration, Benediction & Reposition on Monday, but no confessions. There will not be Mass on Tuesday or Wednesday. Our regular schedule will start up again Friday.

Next weekend I will be gone for my annual Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre Investiture Weekend. Our entire sacrament schedule for Saturday and Sunday will remain as usual. On Monday I will go from the Investiture Weekend to the Michigan State Police Chaplain Conference which will last until Tuesday evening. We will have Mass, Adoration, Benediction & Reposition on Monday (7 October), but no confessions. We will still have Mass on Tuesday. I'll be back to work on Wednesday to play catch up from everything I missed over the past weeks, and then moving into the rectory on Thursday. Thanks for your understanding with all that I'm doing over the next 10 or so days!

The Sixth & Seventh Sorrow

The Sixth Sorrow of Mary is the moment when she holds the lifeless body of her son, Jesus, after His crucifixion. This sorrow is often depicted as the Pietà, where Mary cradles Jesus in her arms, mourning the death of her beloved son. In this moment of intense grief, Mary's heart is pierced with sorrow as she reflects on the suffering and sacrifice that Jesus endured.



The Seventh Sorrow of Mary occurs at the burial of Jesus. After enduring the anguish of witnessing His death, Mary now faces the finality of laying Him to rest in the tomb. This sorrow is filled with a profound sense of separation, as she watches the stone rolled over the entrance, sealing her son's body inside. Her sorrow is not just for the loss of Jesus, but for the immense suffering that humanity will face without Him.

These last two Sorrows of Mary are deeply interconnected, representing the culmination of her profound suffering as the mother of Jesus. In holding her son's lifeless body and then witnessing His burial, Mary experiences the most intense grief a mother can endure: the loss of her child. Yet, these sorrows also reveal Mary's unwavering faith and resilience. Though her heart is pierced by immense pain, she does not lose hope. Instead, she trusts in God's plan and the promise of resurrection, embodying both the sorrow of humanity and the hope of redemption. Together, these final sorrows encapsulate Mary's role in the Passion of Christ, not only as a grieving mother but also as a symbol of faith and the belief in God's ultimate triumph over suffering and death.
