The number shown on the left indicates the page for the day's Scripture readings and Propers. During the 11 a.m. Mass, this page corresponds to the Ignatius Pew Missal, which includes the day's Introit, Communion antiphons, and the Psalm that we sing with the Scripture readings. For the 1 p.m. Mass, the page number relates to the Marian Missal, containing the Propers and Scripture readings.

The numbers displayed on the right side of the board correspond to the hymns sung during Mass. These numbers indicate the hymn numbers found at the top of the hymn page in the Ignatius Pew Missal. I hope this helps!

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

WHAT IS PURGATORY?

Purgatory is a transitional, purifying state for souls who have died in friendship with God but still need to be cleansed of venial sins or lingering effects of forgiven mortal sins before entering heaven. It is not a place of punishment like hell but is seen as an act of divine mercy, allowing souls to attain the holiness required to see God. This doctrine is supported by scripture, including 2 Maccabees 12:45-46, which describes prayers for the dead, implying that such prayers help the deceased, and 1 Corinthians 3:15, which speaks of a person being "saved, but only as through fire," understood as a process of purification. In purgatory, the soul is purified of attachments to sin and undergoes a complete spiritual cleansing. Prayers, sacrifices, and Masses offered by the living can alleviate this process, aiding souls on their journey to heaven. Purgatory highlights God's justice in addressing the effects of sin and His mercy in offering a path to ultimate sanctity, encouraging the faithful to seek forgiveness, atone for sins, and grow in virtue to prepare for eternal life.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Gertrude the Great was a German Benedictine nun, mystic, and theologian. Born in Thuringia, Germany, Gertrude entered the Benedictine convent of Helfta at a young age, where she would spend her entire life. Known for her profound visions and intimate experiences of Christ, she recorded her revelations in several writings, including the *Legatus Divinae Pietatis* ("The Herald of Divine Love"). Her works focus on themes of divine love, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and the

soul's journey toward unity with God. St. Gertrude's mysticism was distinguished by a unique sense of the humanity of Christ, which she felt in personal, even affectionate, interactions with Him. As a result, she became one of the first to promote the devotion to the Sacred Heart, a central theme in later Catholic spirituality. Canonized by Pope Clement XII, St. Gertrude is celebrated as the patron saint of the West Indies, travelers, and those seeking a deeper understanding of God's love. Her feast day is observed on November 16.
