GREATER FLINT AREA MEN'S GROUP

The Greater Flint area men's group will NOT meet this week due to the Thanksgiving holiday so the next meeting will be **Wednesday**, **December 4**, **6:30-8:00pm in the church basement.** Come for fellowship and formation in the Catholic faith. No previous attendance or instruction is necessary. The group will pray Vespers and study the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which is available as a book and for free on the Vatican website.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level 2 atrium, the six- to nine year-old child comes to know about the three great moments in the Salvation History: Creation, Redemption and Parousia. Parousia is the name given to the moment in which God will be "all in all." (1 Corinthians 15:28) At Parousia, the Kingdom will be fully established and will last forever! At the end of the Our Father prayer, we pray: "For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever." (Rev 1:6; 4:11; 5:13) The history begins with Creation, culminates in Redemption, and will be complete at Parousia. It is called the History of the Kingdom of God, and it is told in the Bible.

COMMUNION RAIL CLOTH

The Communion rail cloth, or Houseling cloth, serves a double purpose, one practical, one liturgical. The practical is that should the host drop during distribution, It would fall on the cloth and no where else. The other reason is to indicate that the railing is an extension of the Altar itself. This is why our Communion rail is made of the same marble as the altar. One receives Communion then from the "altar", symbolic of Christ.

When you kneel at the communion rail place your hands under the cloth, taking care not to raise it above your waist area. The intent is to just cover the hands and create a flat surface. If a precious Host should miss the Paten and fall, the cloth will catch it and the Priest will retrieve it safely.

With any new implementation (this one centuries old) there is an adjustment period. Like the reverence of kneeling or receiving on the tongue, using the Communion rail cloth can be another reminder of the miracle and gift of His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Catherine of Alexandria is believed to have lived in the 4th century in Alexandria, a major hub of culture and learning. Catherine is said to have been a noblewoman renowned for her beauty and intelligence. A precocious scholar, she mastered philosophy, rhetoric, science, and theology, skills that became pivotal in her role as a defender of Christianity. According to tradition, she converted to Christianity after experiencing a profound soit of the Virgin Mary and Christ. Her

profound vision of the Virgin Mary and Christ. Her newfound faith led her to confront the Roman Emperor Maxentius, challenging him to abandon paganism and adopt Christianity. Undeterred by the threat of persecution, Catherine engaged in a public debate with fifty of the emperor's most learned philosophers, reportedly converting many of them to Christianity through her eloquence and arguments. This defiance infuriated Maxentius, leading to her imprisonment, torture, and eventual martyrdom.

NORTH END SOUP KITCHEN


