### **MUSIC MINISTRY**

"...and sing the love amazing..."

The hymn "For All the Saints, Who from
Their Labors Rest" was penned by William How in 1864 and paired with music by Joseph Barnby. When a publisher sought to include it in a new hymnal in 1906, they found the cost of obtaining permission for its use prohibitive. Consequently, Ralph Vaughan Williams, the renowned composer and editor of the hymnal, created his own melody, which we sing today. The original tune has since fallen into obscurity. Vaughan Williams emerged as one of the greatest composers of the 20th century, with his hymn tune, "Sine Nomine," appearing in nearly every hymnal worldwide.

## MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

In Catholic tradition, November is dedicated to remembering and praying for the souls of the faithful departed, especially those in Purgatory. This dedication is rooted in our belief in the communion of saints, a spiritual unity that includes those in heaven, those on earth, and those undergoing purification. Throughout November, Catholics are encouraged to visit cemeteries, where we pray for our loved ones and all departed souls, gaining indulgences that the Church offers to aid in their purification. The practice of praying for the dead is connected to the understanding that, through prayer and sacrifice, the faithful can assist those in Purgatory, underscoring that love and mercy extend beyond earthly life. This focus on the departed also encourages us to reflect on our own mortality and the "last things" death, judgment, heaven, and hell. By contemplating these, we are reminded to live with an eternal perspective, seeking to lead lives of virtue and grace. The November dedication is thus a time of hope, compassion, and unity, reinforcing the faith in eternal life and the eventual reunion of all souls in the presence of God.

#### <u>Saint of the Week</u>



St. Charles Borromeo was an influential figure in the Catholic Church and a key leader of the Counter-Reformation. Born in Milan, Italy, into a noble family, he became a cardinal at a young age connections and used his position with great dedication and reformative zeal. Borromeo worked to implement the decrees of the Council of Trent, which aimed to address church abuses

and improve education for clergy. As the Archbishop of Milan, he focused on restoring moral discipline among clergy and laity, establishing seminaries, and supporting religious education for the poor. Known for his deep humility and personal austerity, Borromeo was committed to hands-on care for his community, especially during the 1576 plague outbreak in Milan, when he organized resources and visited the sick. Canonized in 1610, he is celebrated as the patron saint of bishops, catechists, and seminarians, honored for his legacy of reform and pastoral care.
