

This Friday we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, a holyday of obligation. We'll have our regular 12:10 p.m. Mass in the Ordinary Form, and a 6 p.m. Mass in the Extraordinary Form. Because it's a solemnity, the usual abstinence from meat is dispensed. So enjoy a nice steak or some pork or chicken in honor of all the saints!!

On Saturday we celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls). We will have our usual First Saturday Extraordinary Form Mass at 9 a.m., but it will be a sung Mass, rather than a low Mass. Confessions and the Rosary will follow. It's a good reminder to pray for all the souls of the faithful departed. While we might have some expectation based on our experience of whether or not a person died in a state of grace, God is the only judge, and only He knows how long a person may need to

spend in Purgatory. But, by our prayers and sacrifices, we can lessen the time in Purgatory for the souls that are there. How sad it would be if a person has to stay in Purgatory a bit longer because we forgot to pray for them or offer Masses for them!

I will be holding a Server Training/Refresher for all Ordinary Form servers on Saturday, 9 November at 9 a.m. If possible, I would ask that all our current servers attend to be updated and further trained. But, if anyone wants to serve the Ordinary Form Masses but has not yet been a server, you can also attend and be trained. To be a server, you must be a male and have made your first Holy Communion. Serving is a great privilege, since one gets to be much closer than most people to the miracle of Transubstantiation. You can email me if you're interested in becoming a server.

ALL SAINT'S DAY

All Saints' Day, celebrated on November 1, is a feast dedicated to honoring all saints—both canonized and unknown—who are believed to be in heaven. Its origins trace back to the early Church, which initially focused on commemorating martyrs—those who died for their faith. The formal observance of All Saints' Day took shape in the 7th century when Pope Boniface IV consecrated the Pantheon in Rome to the Virgin Mary and all martyrs, instituting a feast day on May 13. In the 9th century, Pope Gregory III moved the feast to November 1, broadening its scope to include not only martyrs but also all saints.

All Saints' Day emphasizes the unity of the Church across time, recognizing that the faithful on earth are spiritually connected to the saints in heaven, who intercede on their behalf. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, and it is celebrated by attending Mass, praying for intercession from the saints, visiting graves, and lighting candles to honor the dead, reflecting the belief in the eternal life of the soul.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Sts. Simon and Jude, two of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus, are celebrated together in due to their shared feast day on October 28. St. Simon, often referred to as Simon the Zealot, is believed to have been part of a radical Jewish sect that sought to overthrow Roman rule in Judea, though his zeal was later redirected toward spreading Christianity. St. Jude, also known as Thaddeus, is famously the patron saint of lost causes. While the New Testament provides limited details about their lives, tradition holds that they

preached the Gospel together in regions such as Mesopotamia and Persia, where they were martyred. Their lives exemplify unwavering faith and dedication to spreading the teachings of Christ, even at the cost of their lives. Their joint feast day underscores their close association in both life and death.
