<u>Greater Flint Area Men's Group</u>

We will meet **September 18th from 6:30-8:00 pm** in the church basement. Come for fellowship and formation in the Catholic faith. No previous attendance or instruction is necessary.

The group will pray Vespers and study Pope Benedict XVI's weekly addresses collected in *Jesus, the Apostles and the Early Church* (Ignatius Press) and available for free on the Vatican website. This week's text is "Barnabas, Silas and Apollos" of January 31, 2007.

THE SECOND & THIRD SORROW

Mary's second sorrow, the "Flight into Egypt", marks a moment of fear and sacrifice for the Holy Family. After the Magi's visit, Joseph is warned by an angel to flee with Mary and the infant Jesus to Egypt, as King Herod seeks to kill the child. This urgent escape, prompted by the looming Massacre of the Innocents, leads them on a long, difficult journey through deserts and wilderness. Mary's sorrow is intensified by the dangers they face and the emotional weight of knowing her child's life is threatened.

Mary's third sorrow, the "Loss of Jesus in the Temple," took place when He was twelve years old. After attending the Feast of Passover in Jerusalem, Mary and Joseph began their journey home, only to realize that Jesus was missing. For three days, they searched for Him in great distress, eventually finding Him in the temple, where He was speaking with the teachers.

Both of these sorrows illustrate Mary's deep anxiety and her unwavering faith. During the search for Jesus, she experiences the pain of uncertainty, struggling to understand His words about being in His Father's house. Yet, like during the Holy Family's time as refugees in a foreign land, Mary embraces the unknown with profound trust in God's plan. Despite her lack of full understanding, she surrenders to His will, finding strength in faith amid hardship and exile. Through these trials, her steadfast devotion to God's purpose remains unwavering.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Joseph of Cupertino (1603–1663) was an Italian Franciscan friar and mystic. Born in Cupertino, Italy, Joseph faced a difficult childhood, often seen as absent-minded and uneducated. Despite his struggles, he cultivated a profound faith and, after several attempts, was accepted into the Franciscan order. His devotion to the Eucharist and the Virgin Mary,



along with his austere lifestyle, led to mystical experiences, including being lifted off the ground while praying. These events attracted attention from both believers and Church authorities, leading to his isolation to avoid undue fame. St. Joseph of Cupertino is now the patron saint of students and aviators, remembered for his humility, simplicity, and unwavering faith.
