

DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

This Wednesday the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Augustine (and the day before we celebrate his mother, St. Monica). Given the long history of service by Augustinians to St. Matthew parish, this has a special importance here. For me, too, as a third order Dominican, St. Augustine's rule is what St. Dominic adopted for his new mendicant order, so it's special for me as well. St. Augustine is a great example of seeking the truth. And even though he wandered away, he finally realized that the truth was present in the Catholic Church. His mother, St. Monica, is also a great witness for parents whose children have wandered away from the faith, and the perseverance it takes in prayer for them to return. Sts. Augustine and Monica, pray for us!

I have noticed over the past few weeks that our Monday evening time for confessions is not quite long enough. I have barely made it out in time to start benediction and reposition on time, and even have had to hear confessions afterwards to accommodate those who waited in line, but could not make their confession before benediction. So, beginning 9 September, I am extending our Monday evening confession time. As of that date, it will begin at 5:00 p.m. (30 minutes earlier), and end at 6:30 p.m. I hope this helps every have a chance to reconcile with God, the Church, and each other through the Sacrament of Penance.

DIVING DEEPER INTO THE FAITH

Breviary

The breviary serves as the official prayer book for the Liturgy of the Hours. The breviary's structure is designed to sanctify the hours of the day, dividing them into distinct offices such as Lauds (Morning Prayer), Vespers (Evening Prayer), and Compline (Night Prayer), among others. Each office includes a series of psalms, canticles, scripture readings, intercessions, and hymns. The breviary ensures that the prayers of the Church are continuous and unified. Traditionally used by clergy and monastic communities, the breviary has become more accessible to the laity, encouraging a broader participation in the daily rhythm of prayer.

Join us for Vespers (Evening Prayer) on Mondays at 6:30 pm, followed by Benediction.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Augustine

St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD) was an important figure in Christian theology and Western philosophy. Born in what is now Algeria, he spent much of his early life in pursuit of truth through various philosophies before converting to Christianity under the influence of his mother, Saint Monica, and the teachings of Saint Ambrose. As a bishop, Augustine wrote extensively on topics



such as the nature of God, original sin, and the human soul. His major works, including "Confessions" and "The City of God," have profoundly shaped Catholic doctrine, particularly through his exploration of the relationship between faith and reason, the nature of grace, and the moral complexities of human life. Augustine's ideas have had a lasting influence, making him one of the most important intellectual figures in the history of the Western world.
