# DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

Today we are making public what I mentioned in passing a few weeks ago: St. Matthew will be participating in the Diocese of Lansing capital campaign called Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3). S3 seeks to raise money to provide families with greater opportunities for scholarships for Catholic schools, pay teachers more so that Catholic schools can retain the best talent we can find, provide more assistance for Catholic school students with special needs, and support local parish life. In the coming weeks, you'll receive a letter from Bishop Boyea asking you to support this campaign so that we can continue to build on the great work our Catholic schools are doing across the Diocese and we can improve our parish campus. I have already made my pledge and hope you will join with me in offering a sacrificial gift for S3!

Saturday we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This not only reminds us of when St. Helena found the true Cross (of which we have a relic at St. Matthew!), but also reminds us that, through His crucifixion, Christ has conquered all suffering, pain, and death. When we experience these things in our life, as we all do, our opportunity as Catholics is to unite them to the cross of Christ, where they can actually lead us closer to the Resurrection. # **MUSIC MINISTRY**

The beloved hymn "I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" was penned by the English poet Horatius Bonar in 1845. Later, the composer Ralph Vaughan William Wil

liams combined it with an English folk song that he described as a "walking tune" The hymn is a conversation between Christ and us.

The first stanza quotes Matthew 11:28–30, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest," with the believer responding, "I came to Jesus as I was." The second stanza draws from John 4:10–14 (where Christ offers living water to the woman at the well), and the believer answers, "I came to Jesus, and I drank." The third stanza refers to John 8:12, "I am the light of the world," and the believer joyfully replies, "I looked to Jesus, and I found."



# THE FIRST SORROW

The Prophecy of Simeon, described in Luke 2:25-35, is the first of the Seven Sorrows of Mary, underscoring the profound spiritual anguish she would endure as Jesus' mother. During the presentation of the infant Jesus at the Temple, Simeon, a devout man, recognized Him as the Messiah and predicted that He would bring both salvation and conflict. He also warned Mary that "a sword will pierce your own soul," foretelling the deep sorrow she would suffer, especially during the crucifixion. This prophecy marks the start of Mary's lifelong journey of sorrow, highlighting her intimate share in her Son's redemptive suffering and her role as the Sorrowful Mother.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Peter Claver was a Spanish Jesuit priest who dedicated his life to serving enslaved Africans in Cartagena, Colombia, a major hub of the transatlantic slave trade. After arriving in the New World in 1610, he was deeply moved by the suffering of the enslaved people and vowed to become "the slave of the
