DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

While some have already returned to school, I think everyone will be back to school this week, which means another summer has come to an end (though fall doesn't technically begin until later in this month). We're back to the time of high school and college football, and the nights will start cooling off. Please pray for all students and teachers as they begin their new academic year.

Monday is Labor Day, and our offices will be closed. We will also not have Mass, adoration, or confessions on Monday. We'll return to our regular schedule on Tuesday.

Speaking of Tuesday, on that day we celebrate Pope St. Gregory the Great. He was truly a great pope for many reasons, but one of his great works was collecting and organizing liturgical chant. He exerted so much influence that the chants that are proper to the Church are called Gregorian chant.

Many people think Gregorian chant went, mostly, the way of the dinosaurs after Vatican II. But, Vatican II did not intend to get rid of chant from Masses. In fact, the first document of the Second Vatican Council, Sacrosanctum concilium, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, stated, "The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services." The US Bishops' document on sacred music, "Sing to the Lord," published in 2007, also says Gregorian chant is uniquely the Church's own music. Chant is a living connection with our forebears in the faith, the traditional music of the Roman rite, a sign of communion with the universal Church, a bond of unity across cultures, a means for diverse communities to participate together in song, and a summons to contemplative participation in the Liturgy.

At St. Matthew, we use Gregorian chant, not only in our Extraordinary Form Masses, but also during the entrance and communion antiphons, as well as during the responsorial psalm and alleluia, and in the different parts of the Mass that I chant in the Ordinary Form.

Music sung during the Mass is meant to be set apart, not similar to other types of music, and, according to both Pope St. Pius X and Pope St. John Paul II, the more that music approaches Gregorian chant, the more sacred and liturgical it is. And, contrarily, the less it approaches Gregorian chant, the less it is fitting for music in the temple of the Church. I don't foresee any major changes to our music, as we generally follow that rule, but I hope that this explains why we chant so much during the Mass.

September is Dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows

The September dedication to Our Lady of Sorrows emphasizes the profound grief that Mary experienced during the Passion of Christ. Celebrated on September 15th, this feast day follows the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14th, highlighting the deep connection between Mary's suffering and the sacrifice of her son, Jesus.

September, a month often associated with reflection and transition, invites the faithful to contemplate the sorrows that Mary endured, particularly during the events leading up to and including the crucifixion. The devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows encourages believers to seek Mary's intercession in their own struggles, drawing strength from her unwavering faith and compassion in the face of immense suffering.

This dedication serves as a poignant reminder of the deep bond between mother and son, illustrating how enduring love triumphs over sorrow.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Rose of Viterbo

St. Rose of Viterbo (1233–1251) was a young Italian saint renowned for her fervent faith and courage. From an early age, she exhibited a deep devotion to God, dedicating herself to prayer and acts of charity. During a time of religious and political strife in her



hometown of Viterbo, she boldly preached against heretical influences, urging her community to remain faithful to the Church. Despite being exiled for her outspoken defense of the faith, Rose continued her mission in nearby regions, inspiring many with her holiness. Although she was denied entry into a convent due to her youth, her piety left a lasting legacy. She passed away at 18, and her incorrupt body is venerated in Viterbo. St. Rose was canonized in 1457, and her feast day is celebrated on September 4th.
